MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF PAKISTAN COUNCIL OF ARCHITECTS AND TOWN PLANNERS (PCATP) 2023 HELD IN HYBRID MODE ON AUGUST 05, 2023 AT ISLAMABAD CLUB, ISLAMABAD

In accordance with the Final Notice circulated by the Registrar PCATP dated July 20, 2023; the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Pakistan Council of Architects and Town Planners (PCATP) was held on Saturday, August 5, 2023, at the Multi-Purpose Hall, Islamabad Club under the Chairmanship of Ar. Muhammad Arif Changezi. Members attended the meeting both physically and virtually via Zoom.

The AGM started at 12 Noon on 5th August, 2023 soon after achieving the quorum under the PCATP byelaws which was 91 at the start of the proceeding.

Questions/ Queries/ Comments raised/submitted by the members in AGM through Zoom is attached as "Comments Submitted by the Participants on Zoom Session" with these minutes.

A list of members of the Council who attended the proceedings of the Annual General Meeting is attached at Annexure-A to the Minutes.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 1 RECITATION FROM THE HOLY QURAN

- 1.1 The meeting started with the recitation of the Holy Quran followed by the National Anthem. Chairman PCATP, Ar. Muhammad Arif Changezi welcomed the participants of AGM 2023, present physically as well as virtually via Zoom. Subsequently, he requested the Registrar to share the approved SOPs on the Code of Conduct during the meeting and to display the QR code for the participants to view the PCATP Annual Report 2022-2023.
- 1.2 The Registrar announced the following SOPs for AGM 2023:
 - a) All the participants (Physical and Virtual) are requested to register themselves for AGM 2023 through the Registration Form available at <https://forms.gle/ns1vH2Yc8BZHSnKr5>
 - b) Connect with your registered PCATP No, name, and email only.
 - c) Use appropriate profile picture, name, and video backgrounds (preferably your own picture as your DP/ profile picture).
 - d) You will enter the waiting room as you connect, please wait and be patient until you are admitted to the meeting.
 - e) Mute your MIC during the entire meeting except for when you are allowed to speak.



- f) Use the "Raise Hand" option or write in Chat box for any questions and wait until you are allowed.
- g) Members who are attending the meeting physically are requested to demonstrate discipline during the AGM so as to maintain decorum and ensure a smooth proceeding.
- h) To give equal opportunity to the participants present physically/ virtually, questions will be taken on a rotation basis from the participants (if the physical attendance is 100 and Zoom attendance is 70 at the moment, then 2 questions will be taken from the physical participants in comparison to 1 question for zoom participants and vice versa).
- i) Due to time limitation if any question(s) are unattended, please leave your questions in the chat box to be answered later by the executive committee.
- j) Update your Zoom client software to the latest version
- k) Test carefully all audio and video settings at your end preferably one hour ahead of the meeting.
- l) PCATP Zoom link is meant for you only. Please do not share it with anyone else and also do not use the link for any testing purposes.

Along with this, QR code was displayed on the screen for participants to download PCATP Annual Report 2022-2023.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON MAY 14, 2022 (VIA HYBRID AND ZOOM)

- 2.1 The Registrar informed the participants that the minutes of the last Annual General Meeting (AGM), held on May 14, 2022 (via Hybrid and Zoom) are attached as Annexure-A in the PCATP Annual Report 2022-2023. It was informed that as per the prescribed rules and procedure the Council had circulated the minutes of the AGM and no comments were received on it. The participants were again asked for any comments on the minutes of the last AGM though, no observations were raised either.

Resolution No. 1

On a motion moved by Ar. Kifayat Hussain and seconded by Ar. Amir Nazir Chaudhary, the House confirmed the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on May 14, 2022.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 3: PRESENTATION OF PCATP ANNUAL REPORT 2022-2023

- 3.1 Registrar PCATP presented the highlights of the Annual Report 2022-2023 covering the reporting period of May, 2022 to June, 2023. She informed on the number of meetings PCATP Executive Committee (2021-2023) held during the reporting period. She acknowledged and thanked the Executive Committee on behalf of the Council who relentlessly provided their services and expertise in prompting Council mandate.



3.2 Registrar briefed the members that the presentation includes agenda items as per the listed items of the PCATP Annual Report (2022-2023) and shall be covered as follows:

3.3 Registrar PCATP apprised the AGM that in yesterday's EC meeting held at the PCATP Secretariat, Islamabad, EC members discussed the implementation procedure of ALE. Following intense discussion, It was decided and approved by the Executive Committee that ALE examination be deferred till the compilation of the complete mechanism for conducting the Architects Licensing Examination (ALE). During this process, all the affected graduates will be entitled to full registration, and registration certificates issued with 'T' shall be withdrawn and replaced with the registration as an Architect. The decision of the EC was endorsed and appreciated by the AGM without a single objection raised by any



- member. 3.4 Chairman PCATP remarked that the decision on ALE was an important decision taken by EC members after a hectic discussion. He added that PCATP will look after the problems of young architects and their demands. Under the convenorship of the Vice Chairman (Architecture), we are going to come up with a better document and mechanism for ALE. Apart from this, we made very important decisions during yesterday's ECM regarding accreditation, examinations for non-accredited batches giving 60 %age weightage to examination and 40% age to studio work from 1st to 10th semester. The house appreciated the decision and approved it without any objection.
- 3.4 Chairman PCATP informed the AGM about his meeting with the Secretary, Local Government and Urban Development Department, Government of, last year on the subject of not incorporating architects' and town planners' views in the new Local Building Control and Planning Rules. They agreed to form a committee represented by PCATP during the meeting in question, but they did not respond afterward. They finally included representatives of the PCATP in the reformation committee to evaluate the by-laws and town planning standards, when the architects and town planners filed a writ petition in Baluchistan High Court. The Chairman lauded the efforts of Ar. Esa Khan for his efforts throughout the process who also played a leading role in arranging contributions through local architects to pay lawyers remuneration without burdening PCATP. After discussion on the matter of architects in Baluchistan, the Vice Chairman Architecture informed the AGM that executive time Committee of P.C.A.T.P. in its 126th meeting held on 4th August has given the approval to extend the jurisdiction of P.C.A.T.P. to AJK and GB. The house approved and appreciated the decision of the Executive Committee without any objection from the members. The Chairman PCATP explained that the decision of the Executive Committee and AGM will be very helpful to address the problems of AJK and GB Architects and Town Planners.
- 3.5 Following the completion of the Registrar's presentation, Chairman PCATP informed the participants that a complaint had been filed last year against Ar. Dr. Waqas Ahmed Mahar by Ar. Dr. Samra Mohsin Khan for his personal remarks against her in the AGM and in social media on the tier system. As per the Inquiry report recommendations, the Chairman invited Ar. Dr. Waqas Ahmed Mahar who was attending via Zoom to apologize in the AGM.
- 3.6 Ar. Waqas Mahar thanked the Chairman PCATP and other Executive Committee members for organizing the AGM-2023 and for their efforts to incorporate academia in the accreditation process. Furthermore, he praised the suspension of ALE for the purpose of compiling a system for ALE conduct and the efforts made for the betterment of the architectural and Town Planning professions in Baluchistan. Finally, in response to the complaint lodged by a respected PCATP member against him, he apologized to her and stated that he had no intention of slandering the reputation of his valued PCATP member. He pledged to respect all of his seniors and assured his complete support to the Council for Professional Development.



AGENDA ITEM NO. 4 PCATP AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2021-2022

4.1 Manager Finance, PCATP presented the PCATP audited accounts report for the financial year 2022 and briefly explained the significant item heads projecting a major variance along with the reasoning of variance under financial statements i.e. Balance Sheet Statement & Income / Expenditure Statement. She further explained the Auditors Report and explained the two observations raised by the Auditor i.e.

1. Tax Compliance issue:

- In previous Years, PCATP retained Non-Profit Organization status and Claimed 100% tax credit under section 100C of Income Tax Ordinance, 2001.
- As per prevailing rules, the approval of 100% tax credit under section 100c is required to be renewed after every three years.

2. RHS Land:

- PCATP Owns land reflected at PKR 21,951,761/- in the Statement of Financial Position as of June 30, 2022.
- The Council retained an amount of PKR 20,200,000/- received as an advance against a deal for the sale of above-mentioned land which could not materialized.

4.2 Manager Finance, PCATP, highlighted that on the recommendation of PCP, we submitted an application under Rule 211 of the rules with Section 2(36) of the Ordinance for renewal of an earlier certificate issued to a non-profit organization to the Pakistan Council of Architects and Town Planners. An exemption application is in process in FBR. Moreover, RHS Land was visited by the PCATP Registrar and EC Members, and it will be re-evaluated in the financial year 2023-2024. The revaluation budget has increased as per the EC member's recommendation.

4.3 Some of the participants attending the meeting physically asked for voting on the budget including the appointment of auditors. The Chairman PCATP did not approve the voting proposal since no amendment to the budget was tabled, none of the online participants who were in majority supported the option for voting and also the disruption by some members prevented the attendees from participation.

Resolution No. 2

On a motion proposed by Ar. Zahid Javed Raja and seconded by Ar. Kifayat Hussain, the House approved the PCATP Audited Accounts of 2021-2022.



AGENDA ITEM NO. 5 PCATP ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2023-2024

- 5.1 Manager Finance, PCATP subsequently presented the PCATP Proposed Annual Budget for 2023-2024. She briefly explained the budget head items with the reasoning of projected values.
- 5.2 Ar. Mohsin Mughal asked about the payments remunerated in terms of salaries to the PCATP staff and lawyers fee etc.
- 5.3 Chairman PCATP replied that accreditation of institutions is a major contributory part in PCATP revenue and directed Registrar PCATP to provide details of PCATP staff's salaries.
- 5.4 Registrar PCATP replied that Rs 8.457 million is the annual salary of PCATP staff and if divided per month then monthly expenditure in respect of salaries is Rs 0.704 million keeping in view the designation, qualification, and experience of the staff as follows: -
- (a) One Registrar 2.5 Lac.
 - (b) Two Assistant Registrars 60 to 85 thousand.
 - (c) Finance Manager
 - (d) IT Assistant 85 thousand.
 - (e) Admin Assistant 78 thousand.
 - (f) Accreditation Coordinator 60 thousand.
 - (g) Office Boy and driver 35 thousand for each.
- 5.6 Chairman PCATP stated that as the Chairman PCATP in my previous term, except for the EC meetings or any urgent official meetings, he did not draw any TA / DA from PCATP on most of the meetings at various cities he visited including Islamabad, Lahore, Multan, Gujrat, Peshawar and Quetta. Being the Vice President of the Architecture and Planning Division of NESPAK, he used to stay at NESPAK rest houses in Islamabad just to save the revenue of PCATP. Moreover, for most of the meetings with the Planning Commission and other govt departments, he preferred attending on Zoom to avoid the traveling cost. Even during the present term, he and the EC members never stayed in hotels rather staying in HEC/ educational institutes mess and rest houses at a very nominal rate.
- 5.7 Ar. Kamran Khan inquired about the grounds used to reject nominated observers from institutions seeking accreditation. Furthermore, he indicated that if EC members and the Chairman PCATP utilize their personal resources to save PCATP money, the budget for TA / DA should be reduced. He also inquired whether PCATP was paying the legal advisor's fee.



- 5.8 Registrar PCATP replied that the observer should have 10 good standings as per PCATP accreditation rules and sometimes nominations forwarded by institutions have to be declined as per PCATP criteria. Chairman PCATP added the legal advisor has been engaged in retainership with the approval of the Executive Committee. He further added that his negotiated fee is extremely low compared to other lawyers in the market.

Resolution No. 3

On a motion proposed by Ar. Zahid Javed Raja and seconded by Ar. Fauzia Asad Khan, the House approved the PCATP Proposed Annual Budget 2023-2024.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 6 APPOINTMENT OF AUDITORS

- 6.1 Manager Finance, PCATP explained to the members that any financial matter pertaining to the Council is handled by the auditors hence appointment of auditors for every financial year is proposed in the AGM. The Council needs to perform an audit of its financial statements by Nov 2023 therefore appointment of auditors is requested for approval. She showed the quotation obtained by the Council from Chartered Accountant Firms.

Resolution No. 4

On a motion proposed by Ar. Esa Khan and seconded by Ar. Aamir Nazir Chaudhary, the House approved the appointment of M/s Moore Shekha Mufti Chartered Accountants as auditors for the annual audit of the year 2022-2023.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 7 ANY OTHER BUSINESS PLACED BEFORE THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 7.1 Chairman PCATP opened the floor to the members for their input on agenda items.
- 7.2 Ar. Mazhar Munir stated that this AGM is illegitimate since it is presenting the performance of 2022-23, and as a member of the previous Executive Committee from Punjab, he should be held accountable for answers to questions if anyone has. The report for the period 2022-23 has been presented without taking any questions. If the floor is not available to the previous committee, then let him know the time and date for the discussion on the subject.
- 7.3 Chairman PCATP responded that no one raised a question about the previous committee's performance, and as the Chairman of the previous committee, I can also respond to any question about the previous committee, unless it is explicitly linked to any member's area of responsibility of the previous executive committee.



- 7.4 Ar. Mazhar Munir stated that he was a member of the Scrutiny Committee for verification of accreditations granted to the institutions and that during the scrutiny, it was revealed that some institutions not meeting the criteria were granted accreditation, despite the disapproval of the Accreditation Board. He highlighted that some institutions were granted NOCs without any accreditation visit. He added that the scrutiny committee formulated the report for subsequent discussion in the committee, but contrary to bye-laws and procedures, the report was not presented in the committee. He further highlighted that a committee for the formulation of election reforms was established under my convenorship. Being the Chairman of PCATP, you did not allow me to call any single session of the committee.
- 7.5 The Chairman responded that if a single case is brought to the floor proving that he had awarded NOC or accreditation to universities/ schools in defiance of Accreditation Board recommendations, he would resign from this Chair. Secondly, as the Chairman, it was his primary responsibility to monitor the operations of committees constituted for specific tasks and to keep them within their scope and TOR. The Chairman reminded him that he was designated for the election reforms, but he tried to exceed the mandate without defining Terms of Reference (TORs) first. Furthermore, the report formulated by the reform committee was brought forward in the previous committee, but the matter was deferred to the next committee. In the same context, the findings of the scrutiny committee were forwarded to the committee under the convenorship of the educational nominee (Architecture) for finalization and was never shelved by the present committee.
- 7.6 Dr Raaeha Abidi, Educational Nominee (Architecture) seconded Chairman PCATP and highlighted that two meetings on the findings of scrutiny committee have already been conducted and she invited Ar. Mazhar Munir to be a part of discussion and subsequent outcomes.
- 7.7 Ar. Amir Nazir Chaudhary inquired about the suspension of the Architects Licensing Exam (ALE) and whether it would be re-implemented after the compilation of reforms for the conduct of examinations after getting input from young architects and voting.
- 7.8 Vice Chairman (Architecture) replied that our first priority is to formulate the reforms and compile a comprehensive mechanism for the conduct of the Architect Licensing Examination System, and then, after deliberation and with the consent of all stakeholders, including academia, the reforms will be finalized.
- 7.9 Plnr. Abdul Waheed who was attending via zoom, indicated that as previously discussed, the Queta Master Plan assigned to the team consists of architects and engineers, but no Town Planners were invited. Town planners should be included in the project as well. He went on to say that Baluchistan is constantly short of personnel like non-professional designations in the judiciary and local government. In conjunction with PEC, a proper structure may be developed, and specialists should be assigned to certain positions.



- 7.10 Vice Chairman (Town Planning) responded that we have already taken up this point from the PCATP forum and this matter has been brought to the attention of additional Secretary Planning Division and this matter has also been discussed in Executive Committee Meeting yesterday and committee unanimously decided that we will peruse every case where a non-professional are designated on any Architectural or Town Planner's post.
- 7.11 Vice Chairman (Architecture) added that on his proposal that the Executive Committee unanimously took the decision to extend PCATP jurisdiction to Azad Kashmir and Gilgit Baltistan.
- 7.12 Ar. Pervez Iqbal stated that he was the candidate for Chairman in the last elections against Ar. Arif Changezi and Ar. Jahangir Khan Sherpao. During the elections, a video was leaked, imposing allegations of hacking on me. Meanwhile, a letter was issued by PCATP making me liable for hacking; lately, it was replaced and my name was removed. Today, he is here to invite all to sit together to remove dissension and dichotomies, and he wanted the Chairman PCATP to apologize for his act of issuing a letter with his name.
- 7.13 Chairman PCATP replied that the letter on PCATP website does not contain his name anymore and the Chairman extended an apology in front of all members for this unintentional act despite that fact Mr Parvez Iqbal's name was taken by the IT company during the election committee meeting. The Chairman further said that he has never used unfair means or passed objectionable remarks against the opposing candidates during the elections or afterwards.
- 7.14 Ar. Pervez Iqbal stated that during the elections, a video had been released in which a person from the M/s Oath Systems named Mr. Azam claimed that the electoral system was hacked and that 232 votes were cast for me. My inquiry is why 232 votes cast in my favor were erased from the system without explanation or criterion.
- 7.15 Chairman PCATP responded that the votes were rejected by the Election Committee, not by him and that he himself was a candidate, just like the other candidates. He was also not part of the Election Committee nor contacted their members even once during the elections and afterward. The Chairman also asked him to wait for the court's decision as the matter was sub-judice.
- 7.16 Ar. Pervez Iqbal and Chairman PCATP were thanked by Ar. Zahid Javed Raja for their public expressions of regret and subsequent apologies. He urged Ar. Pervez Iqbal and PCATP Chairman to advance sincerely for the benefit of the Council and its members.
- 7.17 Chairman PCATP instructed Ar. / Plnr. Jahangir Khan Sherpao to address the chair when he tried to address Registrar PCATP directly by reading the resolution which he later submitted to Registrar PCATP by-hand.
- 7.18 Ar. / Plnr. Jahangir Sherpao, stated, "I have submitted the resolution to the Registrar with signatures and a photocopy of the FIA report proving hacking from Chairman PCATP's house during elections." I request that this resolution be read out loudly in front of the entire house.



7.19 The Chairman responded that an interim FIA report submitted to the court prior to recording of my statement was unfortunately being projected as the final and as a proof to put blame on me, otherwise, FIA never charged me for any wrongdoing after my statement was recorded along with the PCATP member whose email address was hacked in an unsuccessful attempt to cast 232 votes in favor of an opposing candidate, as per statement of the IT Co given to the election committee. He further tried to elaborate about hacking charges but Ar/ Plnr Jahangir Khan and his associates namely Ar. Qasim Abbas, Ar. Ar Usman Mirza and some others sitting with them started shouting slogans like hacker, hacker, vote chor, vote chor and passed other obnoxious remarks which did not allow the Chairman to speak further. The AGM turned into total chaos as a result of the disruption by the same group.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 8 CLOSING COMMENTS BY CHAIRMAN PCATP

Chairman PCATP had to adjourn the meeting after disruption by some members who did not allow the AGM proceedings to go ahead. He apologized to the members joining via Zoom for the abrupt adjournment due to disruption by a group and requested those on Zoom to submit their questions/ points via email. He further thanked all the participants who attended the meeting physically / virtually and devoted their precious time for the AGM.
